

READY, SET, READ!

Here is a list of exciting books to be released in March & April
Check out the review, place your hold and get reading!

March

***Klara and the Sun* by Kazuo Ishiguro (Mar 02)**

This is the story of Klara, an Artificial Friend with outstanding observational qualities, who, from her place in the store, watches carefully the behavior of those who come in to browse, and of those who pass on the street outside. She remains hopeful that a customer will soon choose her.

Klara and the Sun is a thrilling book that offers a look at our changing world through the eyes of an unforgettable narrator, and one that explores the fundamental question: what does it mean to love?

***The Lamplighters* by Emma Stonex (Mar 04)**

Cornwall, 1972. Three keepers vanish from a remote lighthouse, miles from the shore. The entrance door is locked from the inside. The clocks have stopped. The Principal Keeper's weather log describes a mighty storm, but the skies have *been clear all week. Twenty years later, the women they left behind are still struggling to move on. And then a writer approaches them. He wants to give them a chance to tell their side of the story. But only in confronting their darkest fears can the truth begin to surface . . .*

***Libertie* by Kaitlyn Greenidge (Mar 30)**

Coming of age as a free-born Black girl in Reconstruction-era Brooklyn, Libertie was all too aware that her mother, a practicing physician, had a vision for their future together: Libertie would go to medical school and practice alongside her. But Libertie feels stifled by her mother's choices and is hungry for something else. And she constantly reminded that, unlike her mother who can pass, Libertie has skin that is too dark. When a young man from Haiti proposes to Libertie and promises she will be his equal on the island, she accepts, only to discover that she is still subordinate to him and all men.

As she tries to parse what freedom actually means for a Black woman, Libertie struggles with where she might find it—for herself and for generations to come.

***Return of the Trickster* by Eden Robinson (Mar 30)**

Jared wakes up in a hospital bed feeling like hell. Some of the people he loves assume he fell off the wagon after a tough year of sobriety. They think that's why movers found him naked, dehydrated, and confused in his mom's old house in Kitimat. The truth for Jared is so much worse. He finally knows that he has no hope of ever being normal because he really is the son of Wee'git, a Trickster, and he is the only one of Wee'git's children who is a Trickster, too. There's more bad news: the only person in his life who is happy that he's a Trickster is his ex, Sarah. Everyone else he loves is either mad at him or in danger from the dark forces he's accidentally unleashed in their world. A horrible place to be for the sweetest Trickster there's ever been, one whose first instinct is not mischief and mind games but to make the world around him a kinder, safer, place.

***The Last Exiles* by Ann Shin (Apr 06)**

Jin and Suja fell in love while studying at university in Pyongyang. She was from a prominent family, while he was from a small village. Outside the school, North Korea has fallen under great political upheaval, plunged into chaos and famine. When Jin returns home to find his family starving, he makes a rash decision that will haunt him for the rest of his life. Meanwhile, Suja is feeling the tenuousness of her privilege when she learns that Jin has disappeared. Risking everything, Suja sets out to find him, embarking on a dangerous journey that will test their love and will to survive.

***Hana Khan Carries On* by Uzma Jalaluddin (Apr 06)**

Sales are slow at Three Sisters Biryani Poutine, the only halal restaurant in their close-knit neighbourhood. Hana waitresses there, but what she really wants is to be on the radio. In the meantime, Hana pours her dreams into a podcast, where she forms a lively relationship with one of her listeners. But soon she'll need all the support she can get: a new, more upscale halal place, is about to open nearby, threatening Three Sisters. A hate-motivated attack on their neighbourhood complicates the situation further, as does Hana's growing attraction for Aydin, the young owner of the rival restaurant—who might not be a complete stranger after all.

***Broken (In the Best Possible Way)* by Jenny Lawson (April 13)**

As Jenny Lawson's hundreds of thousands of fans know, she suffers from depression. In *Broken*, she explores her experimental treatment of transcranial magnetic stimulation with brutal honesty. But also with brutal humor. She tackles timelessly debated questions and we see how her vacuum cleaner almost set her house on fire, how she was attacked by three bears, business ideas she wants to pitch to Shark Tank, and why she can never go back to the post office. Of course, Jenny's long-suffering husband Victor—the Ricky to Jenny's Lucille Ball—is present throughout.

***Letters Across the Sea* by Genevieve Graham (Apr 27)**

1933: At eighteen, Molly feels the stress of the Great Depression. The one bright spot in her life is her best friend Hannah, and sneaking glances at Hannah's older brother, Max. Molly knows that her parents disapprove of her spending time with their Jewish neighbours, and she also sees the anti-semitic signs around Toronto. As Hitler's hateful ideas cross the sea, tensions between their families and communities rise, spilling over when a local "Swastika Club" unfurls a huge white banner bearing the Nazi symbol. A riot erupts, throwing Molly and Max together and sparking a secret they must keep from everyone they love. When Max enlists to fight overseas, their love is put to the ultimate test. By war's end, both of their families will be scarred by painful betrayal as devastating truths come to light.
