The Secret Lives of Country Gentlemen by KJ Charles  
(07 Mar) 

Sir Gareth is prickly, cold, and used to disappointment. Yet he longs for a connection, falling into an anonymous affair that's over almost before it began. Then his father dies, leaving him the family title, a manor on the Romney Marsh...plus the smugglers that make its waterways their home. Joss has run the Doomsday smuggling clan since he was a boy. His family is his life, so when the all-too-familiar new baronet testifies against Joss's sister, Joss acts fast, blackmailing Gareth. Their reunion is not happy and the path forward not easy, yet neither can stay away. It's a long and dangerous road yet somehow, along the way, this well-mannered gentleman may find true love with the least likely of scoundrels.

Vera Wong's Unsolicited Advice for Murderers by Jesse Q. Sutanto (14 Mar)

Vera Wong is a lonely--ah, lady of a certain age--who lives above her tea shop. Despite living alone, Vera is not needy, oh no. Then one morning, Vera trudges downstairs to find a curious thing--a dead man in the middle of her tea shop. In his hand, a flash drive. Vera doesn't know what comes over her, but after calling the cops, she sort of...swipes the flash drive from the body. Why? Because Vera is sure she would do a better job than the police possibly could. Vera knows the killer will be back for the flash drive; all she has to do is watch the increasing number of customers at her shop and figure out which one among them is the killer.

The London Seance Society by Sarah Penner (21 Mar) 1873. At an abandoned chateau on the outskirts of Paris, a dark séance is about to take place, led by spiritualist Vaudeline D'Allaire. Known worldwide for her talent in conjuring the spirits of murder victims, she is highly sought after by widows and investigators alike. Lenna Wickes has come to Paris to find answers about her sister's death, but to do so, she must embrace the unknown and overcome her own logic-driven bias against the occult. When Vaudeline is beckoned to England, Lenna accompanies her as an understudy. But as the women team up with the powerful men of London's Séance Society, they begin to suspect that they are not merely out to solve a crime, but perhaps entangled in one themselves...

Funeral Songs for Dying Girls by Cherie Dimaline

(04 April) 

Winifred has lived above the cemetery office with her father, who works in the crematorium, all her life. She has settled into a summer schedule, lugging her Chihuahua around the grounds. Her habit of wandering the graveyard at all hours has started a rumor that the cemetery is haunted. It's welcome news since the crematorium is at risk of closure and her father's job being outsourced. With ghost tours have starting, Winifred just might be able to save her father's job. But when Phil, an actual ghost of a teen girl, starts showing up, Winifred begins to question everything she believes about life, love and death. Especially love.

Homecoming by Kate Morton (14 April)

1959: On the grounds of a mansion, a terrible discovery is made. A police investigation is called and a town becomes embroiled in a murder case. Sixty years later, Jess is a journalist in search of a story, having been laid off. A phone call summons her back to Sydney, where her grandmother, Nora, has suffered a fall and is in hospital. When Jess visits her, she is alarmed to find her grandmother frail and confused. Alone in Nora's house, Jess does some digging and discovers a true crime book, chronicling the investigation into the Turner Family Tragedy of Christmas Eve, 1959. As Jess skims through the book she finds a shocking connection to her own family and this old crime that has never been resolved.

In the Lives of Puppets by TJ Klune (25 April)
